US President Donald Trump has announced that he has directed the Secretary of War, and other US Government agencies to “begin the process of identifying and releasing Government files related to alien and extraterrestrial life, unidentified aerial phenomena (UAP), and unidentified flying objects (UFOs) and any and all other information connected to these highly complex, but extremely interesting and important matters.” This public disclosure process will commence imminently.

UAP have been an enduring topic of public curiosity since the Second World War, but the credibility and import of UAP information leapt in December 2017 when the *New York Times* and *Washington Post* released detailed information about secret Pentagon UAP study programs. That media campaign triggered Congressional hearings, deeper investigative journalism and whistleblowers publicly outing themselves; all of which painted a clear picture that, despite decades of assertions to the contrary, UAP are real and a topic of serious investigation deep inside the US Intelligence Community.

The disclosure process ordered by President Trump will unfold slowly but with lasting impact. There will be significant challenges to public and private sector risk leaders falling out from this process. Those challenges are manifold, their impacts difficult to predict but will likely be very disruptive.

Because UAP are mostly unknown actors that represent uncertain challenges, Strategic Risk Policy® presents an excellent analytical lens to anticipate the impact of the UAP disclosure process. Strategic Risk Policy® focuses information-gathering, analysis and effort on protecting against identified vulnerabilities, rather than wasting invaluable time waiting to determine details of actual threats and threat actors.

The precise implications of what exactly the presence of UAP means to humanity cannot be answered without a thorough understanding of information that has been withheld to date. That information will soon be made public, and likely in an iterative manner over an extended period of time.
